

## Proviseur's P.& C. Report

School year 2018

*October 2018*

We are now entering the last term of the Australian school year:

- Our EFS year 7 begin their 1<sup>st</sup> term of 4eme and Y8, Y10 and Y11 students continue to intensely prepare their French exams
- We are preparing graduation and formal ceremonies which will take place at the end of the term, for our students, and particularly for our Y6 and Y10 students.
- And, very soon, Saturday 3 November will be held "la Grande Fête". I am thanking P&C members for the big preparation job they do to support and highlight the school.

### Students' achievements, certifications and examinations

- In the end of term 3, the students received their French (for Y8 and Y7) and Australian **reports** which were the basis of the discussions between parents and teachers during parent-teacher interview which occurred, before the break.
- In the Primary, parents also had the possibility to meet their children's teachers. And during the "**learning journey day**", this Thursday 25 October, they will realise the big work done by their children, with their teachers' support.
- In partnership of the Language Center of Brisbane, we organised on 19th and 20th of October, **Cambridge examinations** for 23 students and 2 adults. Some of our students will also sit for DELF junior; this last exam is organised by the Alliance française.
- Next week, we shall begin the **enrolment** of our students **for the French exams** which will take place in December 2018 and in June 2019: "Baccalauréat, épreuves anticipées du baccalauréat et brevet".
- Week 9 and 10, **first mock exams** will be organised for EFS Y10 and 11.
- Week 10 will be the week of the **TPE assessment for our EFS Y10 students and of the second PE evaluation session for our EFS Y11 students** counting for the French Baccalaureate (the 1<sup>st</sup> session already took place, beginning of July 2018).

- The Secondary French teachers and I will work this term on the implementation of the reform of the new French baccalaureate which will be held in 2021.

- In order for Le lycée Franco-Australien to become a test center for the French baccalaureate exam, I have developed a file that has been sent to AEFÉ and the French Ministry of National Education. The final decision should come soon.

In the meantime, I have contacted the company EXATECH which is partner of the AEFÉ for this operation, as well as with the ACT IT department, to know all the technical considerations and anticipate any problem. In annex, you will find the technical sheet and specifications for the purchase of the required scanner on which the P & C had agreed in principle.

### Post-bac guidance

- During term 4, different **information sessions** are planned with:
  - with ANU, mid November
  - NEOMA ( French business school in Rouen and Reims), by Skype
  - ESSEC business school located in France, Singapore and Morocco, by skype.
- On 29 and November 30, our EFS Y11 students will travel to **Sydney** to meet

professionals at the French-Australian Chamber of Commerce in the morning.

They will attend in the afternoon, after meeting their peers at Lycée Condorcet, the **job fair** organized by Condorcet High School and the French Embassy. Our students will have the opportunity to meet professionals, students and representatives of Classes Préparatoires aux Grandes Ecoles in France, Campus France and the French Embassy, Paris Dauphine University, Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne...

They will get informations in the following areas:

practicing in the following areas:

- Letters, human sciences and journalism,
- Economy, finance, management and tourism
- Health and sport
- Science and engineering
- International law and security

A grant has been requested from the guidance service of the AEFÉ.

- On the afternoons of week 9, EFS Y10 and Y11 students will attend guidance workshops at ANU.
- Concerns have recently arisen about the validity of the table converting the student's average mark of the French baccalaureate into ATAR.

The relevant services of the French embassy work with the principal of Condorcet and me, to understand the current difficulties and provide more clarity to our students and their families on this issue. Contacts have been made, to this end, with the chairman of the group of eight and the UAC.

Thanks to the French Embassy for its support.

### **Projects / School excursions**

- ❖ Exchanges with Noumea in New Caledonia

- The 1<sup>st</sup> part of the exchange with College Baudoux with 34 Year 6 students and 4 teachers went well, end of week 9 and week 10.

We shall welcome at the end of this week till 3 November, 37 Y7 Noumea students at TPS. The Caledonian students will be at school next Monday and Friday. Everything ready in the organization of this week, thanks to Mrs CLACY.

- The second part of the exchange with Lycée Garnier and some of our EFS Year 11 students took place during October holidays. Our students and Narrabundah students have been hosted by New Caledonian students.

- ❖ Not to miss the exhibition "100 ans, 100 years, a journey to remember..." commemorating the armistice ending WWI. The photographic works of the KG teacher, Christine RUFFLET, will be exhibited in our library, from November 5th to 23rd. Opening on November 5th, 4.30pm. Parents invited. Thank to the P&C for promoting this event in our community.

Our Primary choir has also been asked by the French Embassy to participate at the commemoration of this Centenary, Sunday 11 November.

Also ceremony in front of the school, Friday 9 November.

- ❖ « Semaine des lycées français du Monde » from 19 to 24 November. For the second edition of this multi-form event, there will be a single thread: plurilingualism and cultural plurality, assets of the AEFÉ network. Perfect for us.

Boris GRUNDLER in charge of the school communication will work on it to highlight our school achievements through the Astrolabe Project.

The Committee classified the teachers' applications for training, according to the priorities of our strategic plan.

The identified priorities are:

- Strengthening reading basics and writing skills in Cycle 2
- Strengthening spelling basics and writing in the cycle 3
- Reinforcement of Primary Mathematics Education
- High school reform
- Positive evaluation

14 teachers have signed up for 37 of the 18 out of 29 proposed traineeships. We decided to send 6 colleagues for overseas training sessions.

- Mrs SCUBLA from Sydney who will work with our teachers about French and Literature from Y7 to 10 – curriculum and assessment

Differentiated Instruction Professional Learning Strategy in Maths

- Mr POUJET from Jakarta, on Cycle 4 Maths curriculum in Maths and use of IT tools in the learning activities

Myriam RAULT went to Bangkok for the annual meeting of the French headmasters of Asia-Pacific AEFE area, 2<sup>nd</sup> week of the October break.

18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> October, with the support of the French Embassy, **AAFEBS - Australian Association of Bilingual French-English Schools** – organised its PL days for some teachers from schools members of the network, at Unley High School, Adelaide.

Myriam RAULT animated and supervised with Douglas Bastick, AEFE expert teacher, the Professional learning about pedagogical differentiation in language teaching.

Laurence BARTHELEMY and Rose CLARKE who attended the PL will soon make a feedback experience to their peers.

The Australian Association for French English Bilingual Schools now has 16 school members from ACT, NSW, QLD, VIC, SA and WA, and a NZ associate school member.

This great success is due in particular to the sharing of Telopea Park school's experience and expertise in bilingualism. And it is also due to Kerrie and my predecessor who were at the origin of this association. Many thanks to Kerrie who was a great chair of the association, until last week.

Veronique DANJOU, Headmaster of the French Australian PreSchool of Red Hill- Canberra - has been elected new President of AAFEBBS.

The next AAFEBBS PL and AGM will take place in October 2019, in Canberra.

This term is also a time we intensely **prepare 2019 academic year.**

- Preparation of the arrival of our future Kindies. Many actions will take place to prepare the important transition between Red Hill Primary School and Telopea Park.
- I have conducted a specific meeting for parents of future EFS Y7 students and answer to their questions. On October 25<sup>th</sup> a meeting for parents will be held with all Y7 parents.
- We also do staffing for February 2019. New EFS positions for August 2019 will be published in December.

#### Context

From 2019 and for the years to come, all French exam copies will be scanned for a dematerialized correction in the Asia-Pacific zone.

A request to open an examination center for all the baccalaureate exams has been made and is based on a fourfold observation:

- cohorts constantly increasing, even significant in the coming years
- The costs incurred for the preparation of the baccalaureate and travel to Sydney are far from negligible, related to the cost of living and the socioprofessional categories of families for the vast majority, Australian.
- The institution has experience in organizing exams and dematerialization
- The school can host the events under completely satisfactory conditions.

This will concern each year, about 100 candidates (50 for the brevet, 25 in Y11 and 25 in Y12)

#### Requested material:

The models of the recommended scanner which equip the foreign centers is Canon DR-6030C: to scan 500 compositions \* or less per day

\* "Composition" means a "copy", in the sense of all the copy sheets made by a student for a test.

Both models can scan A3 sheets in single-sided color in one pass.
